Bible Study:

Genesis 9:13

13 I have set my rainbow in the clouds, and it will be the sign of the covenant between me and the earth.

1. What does the word covenant mean?
2. Why did God send the rainbow?
3. Why do you think God tells us about His promises?
4. Have you ever made a promise and forgotten to keep it?
5. Does God keep His promises?
6. Can you think of any promises that God has made?

This verse is from a book called 'Genesis' which is the very first book in the Bible. This verses comes after the story of Noah's ark and the flood. God sent a rainbow to show that He will never flood the earth again. God has also made lots of other promises. He promises to love us forever (Psalms 136:1), to never leave us (Hebrews 13:5), to comfort us (Isaiah 44:13), to help us (Psalm 121:1-2), to always be faithful (Psalms 33:4), to keep us safe (Nahum 1:7) and to keep His promises (Deuteronomy 7:4)

Worship Activity:

In Genesis 9, the rainbow was a sign of Gods promise. Spend some time listening to God and ask Him what promise He wants to remind you of. Maybe there is one from our study that really stuck out.

On a piece of card, gently make a pattern using masking tape. Over the top use paints, pencils or crayons to create a rainbow. When you have done that, take off the tape and you will be able to see the pattern you have made. Somewhere write down the promise that God has reminded you of. As you do this, worship God by thanking Him for always keeping His promises.

God speaks to us in different ways, sometimes with words or with pictures or even feelings. But remember, when God speaks to us it is always something that draws us closer to Him.
